How to make double-sided Flash Cards:

- Print multiple phonograms on white card
- Cut out so you have 32 Flash Cards showing the phonogram at the top and an example of its use below. The phonograms are numbered.
- Fold & glue down so you have a double sided flash card, check that the numbers correspond.
- Hold up a Flash Card and teach the **sound** of the phonogram shown. Some phonograms have more than one sound. Give examples of all the sounds.
- These can also be used in a standard word chute or make your own for independent study.
